These five ministries (and others) have formed a partnership to offer all countries a complete package to begin or accelerate lasting revivals and protect against syncretism and recidivism.

They offer an excellent video introduction to Jesus Christ; an invitation to accept Jesus Christ through a Listening Program and the study of the Gospel of John. Once they complete the Listening Program, they are eligible to receive a Bible in their own language, and, if able, enter The Timothy Program International’s accredited Bible college curriculum for all levels of interest. The Timothy Program International’s curriculum is based solely upon the Bible. All partners in the “End to End” project are dedicated to holding the Bible as “God’s Word.”

These partners work together without “carrying each other’s water.” That is, none interfere with the goals, funding or administration of the other’s ministry or mission. They compliment each other by supporting and promoting each other, and, reporting to each other the need for their ministries throughout the earth. When the “package” is offered at a called meeting, a representative from each partner ministry is present. Each ministry bears the costs of sending their own representative to called meetings. All contact persons for each “End to End” partner are identified at a called meeting. Each contact person’s information is given to the delegates at a called meeting to ensure success moving forward.

Crucial Facts About The Timothy Program International

To Maintain Accreditation

1. All local Headmasters must report to the TPI national leaders.
2. All local professors must have at least one higher degree than they teach.
 - a. Bachelor degree professors may teach Associate degree students.
 - b. Master degree professors may teach Bachelor degree students.
 - c. Doctoral degree professors may teach Master degree students.

Professors with degrees from other disciplines are acceptable with approval.

3. All TPI teaching materials are copyrighted and may never be sold.
4. All TPI teaching materials are available on the TPI web site.
5. Only authorized professors are given access codes to the TPI web site.
6. Grading and record keeping are mandatory at all local TPI campuses.
7. TPI Headmasters & campuses must be approved by TPI national leaders.

To Establish Campuses

1. Potential Headmasters invite TPI national leaders to locality. National leaders accept the date for “getting acquainted” meeting. TPI provides all travel costs associated with first meeting.
2. Potential Headmasters invite TPI national leaders to a one-day conference and secure the attendance of potential TPI students. TPI national leaders accept the date. Potential TPI students enroll for the two-day TPI conference. TPI provides all travel costs associated with one-day conference.
3. Potential Headmasters invite TPI national leaders to a two-day conference and secure the attendance of potential TPI students. TPI national leaders accept the dates. Potential TPI students enroll for the TPI program. Potential Headmasters are vetted by the TPI national leaders. Campus sites are approved by the TPI national leaders. TPI provides all travel costs associated with two-day conference.
4. Approved local Headmasters fix the costs of tuition and materials. Approved local Headmasters are given access to the TPI web site for both student and professor files, teaching videos, diaries and examinations (+ keys).

Requirements of the: Timothy Program International

Headmaster

The TPI Headmaster is the individual solely in charge of an authorized local TPI campus. All TPI Headmasters must complete as a minimum TPI Track One Quarters 1 through 8 and have received a TPI Associate of Biblical Studies degree, or, an equivalent and approved degree from another Bible college. It is preferred that they complete TPI Track One Quarters 1 through 12 and have received a TPI Bachelor of Biblical Studies degree, or, an equivalent and approved degree from another Bible college. Each Headmaster's qualifications will be verified and approved by the TPI president for each nation. Usually, transcripts are provided to the TPI president for approval.

TPI Campus Locations & Requirements

To avoid costly construction and maintenance of new buildings, the preferred TPI campus locations are found in existing church facilities. The following equipment serves TPI campuses the best: 1) tables and chairs; 2) proper lighting and ventilation; 3) large monitor with computer access to view lesson videos; 4) the ability to print student notes, diaries, sermon verification forms and exams; and, a secure file cabinet to store all records.

TPI's Specially Designed Curriculum

The TPI curriculum is designed to be used as is the medical curriculum designed—"Learn one," "Do one," "Teach one." Therefore, qualified TPI professors are able to—"Learn the lesson," "Preach the lesson" (twice), then, "Teach the lesson." In this way, approved TPI campuses can begin immediately under the leadership of an approved Headmaster and with approved professors. The TPI curriculum is based solely upon the Bible and each lesson provides the student an outline to preach to his/her family and to his/her congregation. This avoids studying twice each week for the church and for the degree. The TPI exams are based solely upon the TPI notes and teaching videos. At TPI mentoring campuses, all TPI Quarterly exams are 100 multiple choice questions with a one hour time limit. All TPI exams are to be taken in the presence of an elder. The TPI Track One curriculum is based upon 13 week quarters. Each TPI T1 Quarter offers 10 credit hours when: 1) all diaries are completed; 2) all sermons have been preached to family and congregation accompanied by a signed verification form; 3) a value added form is completed; and, 4) the final exam is completed and scored with a passing grade.

TPI's Commitment For Success

The nation's TPI president and staff are available to launch and guide new approved TPI campuses. Furthermore, following the three visits to establish a local TPI campus, they are available by telephone, E-mail and texting for advice, counsel and direction. All travel, food and lodging for visits to established local TPI campuses by TPI's president and staff are funded by local TPI campuses. Whenever possible, all graduations will be attended by the Chancellor of the Timothy Program International, whether in person or by electronics such as SKYPE (and others).
